This Year's Grade 7's *(Presently at J.R. Smallwood Middle School)*

- Specialty Request Letter forwarded to Smallwood Middle School by April 23rd
- Rank selections 1 to 4; 1 being the one they want most to 4, the least.
- To be returned to *Smallwood Home Room Teacher* Monday May 7th
- Parent meeting Thursday May 3rd at 7:00 pm in the Menihek Library
- Orientation session tentatively May 18th
- Students entering Grade 8 and select **Music BAND** as a specialty course will have it for the full year.

- To be returned to Home Room Teacher.

Do Not Select Histoire du Canada 1231

- There are four (4) optional credits to select. These course selections must come from those listed on the request sheet.
- **The restrictions placed on selecting Biology or Chemistry will be strictly adhered to. If students select one of these courses and do not meet the academic requirements after the June evaluation, they WILL NOT be placed in the course.**

Academic

MUST Select English 1201
and one of
Writing 2203, French 1200 or Canadian Literature 2204

MUST Select Math 1201

MUST Select Canadian Studies.

**Canadian History 1201
or Canadian Geography 1202
or Canadian Law 2204**

Please note that Canadian Law is a more advanced course and should only be attempted by stronger academic students.

MUST Select Science 1206

MUST Select Career Development 2201

- There will be two (2) optional credits to select. These course selections must come from those listed on the request sheet.
- The restrictions placed on selecting Biology or Chemistry will be strictly adhered to. If students select one of these courses and do not meet all the academic requirements after the June evaluation, they WILL NOT be placed in the course.

Practical

- Many of these students may only have a limitation in Math or Science or English. These students should speak with Ms. Smith.
- It is quite possible for a student taking one practical course may be enrolled in academic courses in other curriculum areas.
- Students selecting a complete practical program including; Practical English, Practical Science and Practical Mathematics can follow the path below.

May Select English 1202 (dependent on success in previous courses)

May Select English 1200 as an optional language arts course

May Select Math 1202 (dependent on success in previous courses)

MUST Select Canadian Studies.

Canadian Geography 1202 or Canadian History 1201

Note: Canadian History requires extensive reading and completion of written assignments.

May Select Science 2200 (dependent on success in previous courses)

MUST Select Career Development 2201

There will be two (4) other credits to select at this point for a total of 14.

(Students to fill in the courses they are presently taking as well as those you wish to select.)
- Keep in mind the requirements for graduation as outlined on the Course Registration Information Package
 - Generally, you should be looking at:
 - Mathematics
 - English Language Arts
 - Science
 - Then your graduation requirements in one or more of the following:
 - Fine Arts
 - Physical Education
 - World Studies
 - Courses from the "other required" courses area
 - If you are continuing with French Immersion, Français 2202 **and** Histoire du Canada 1231 are both required.

Selecting Courses for Level III

- Keep in mind the requirements for graduation as outlined on the Course Registration Information Package.
- Generally, they should be looking at completing their graduation requirements in ALL the different areas before they look at optional courses.
- French Immersion Students **MUST** select Français 3202 and Histoire Mondiale 3231
